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

A Minute from the Minutes Inspirational Nuggets From Past Assembly Minutes


(Excerpts from message by A. T. Griffin entitled "The Basic Elements of Spirituality" preached at the 58th Annual Assembly in 1963)

We could very well say, "The Foundation Elements of Spirituality." Basic means fundamental. If you have spirituality in your heart and life it is the result of some basic element. You have obtained something that brought about spirituality. Spirituality is not based on a shout. But for that shout to amount to anything, it has to come from a basic source. "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith," (Gal. 5:22). If we have the Spirit of God in our hearts and lives, we will have the love of God. You may say that you love your brother or sister, but the Spirit of God will manifest itself. We do not have to put on a program of love. It just works automatically. The love of God is a basic element of the Spirit of God. Love does not just go to this brother and stop. It goes everywhere. The love of God will go a long way in solving your problems. Jesus said that by this all men would know if we have love one to another. Not if we shout a little. Not if we talk about our neighbor a little. Without the Spirit of God you have no love. You may have friendship or buddyship, but no fellowship.

One of the basic elements is also joy. The Spirit of God will bring joy into your life. With joy we draw water out of the wells of salvation. Maybe joy is the bucket, but sometimes people love the bucket. Sometimes people determine spirituality by observation. They look at someone shouting and jumping benches and determine him to be spiritual. If you do not have the basic element in there, you will not walk right on the other side of the bench. Before I was saved, I repented. Then I went over and made things right with my brother. When I got everything fixed up I got sanctified. The old man Adam is gone when you get sanctified. When you get sanctified, it brings about this great joy. When you shout and praise the Lord with joy, you will know how to live the life the next day.

Touching the Hem of His Garment

In Matthew 9:20-22 and in Luke 8:43-48 we find the account of a woman who had a lingering health problem. She had endured an issue of blood condition for some twelve years. During that time, she had spent all her living on physicians, but none of them were able to help her.

In her desperation she sought help from Jesus. She did not hope to be able to approach him directly, due to the "unclean" nature of her ailment. Consequently, she sought to secretly (outside of the public's eye) to approach close enough to Him in the crowd that thronged Him that she would be able to touch the hem of his garment as he passed by.

Matthew 9:20-22

- (20) And, behold, a woman, which was diseased with an issue of blood twelve years, came behind him, and touched the hem of his garment:
- (21) For she said within herself, **If I may but touch his garment, I shall be whole.**
- (22) But Jesus turned him about, and when he saw her, he said, Daughter, be of good comfort; thy faith hath made thee whole. And the woman was made whole from that hour.

Luke 8:43-48

- (43) And a woman having an issue of blood twelve years, which had spent all her living upon physicians, neither could be healed of any,
- (44) Came behind him, and touched the border of his garment: and immediately her issue of blood stanched.
- (45) And Jesus said, Who touched me? When all denied, Peter and they that were with him said, Master, the multitude throng thee and press thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me?
- (46) And Jesus said, Somebody hath touched me: for I perceive that virtue is gone out of me.
- (47) And when the woman saw that she was not hid, she came trembling, and falling down before him, she declared unto him before all the people for what cause she had touched him, and how she was healed immediately.
- (48) And he said unto her, **Daughter, be of good comfort: thy faith** hath made thee whole; go in peace.

Her faith was that her simply touching His garment would be sufficient for her to be healed. Her effort was rewarded beyond her wildest dreams. Not only was she delivered of her ailment, but the Lord recognized that He had been touched, not only in the physical sense, but also in a spiritual sense: **Somebody hath**

touched me: for I perceive that virtue is gone out of me. (Luke 8:46.)

This woman's intention was to secretly secure her healing and to go her way back into society and live a normal life (free of this ailment). Her thought had been that her interaction with the great healer would be limited in scope and influence. He need not know that she had touched Him! Obviously, the secrecy part of her plan had changed when the Master exposed her actions to the crowd around Him.

I have often wondered just what did become of this woman. Had anything else changed in her life? She is not explicitly mentioned again in Scripture. Might we be able to find indications in other passages of Scripture that suggest what became of her, or what course her life had now taken?

This healing of the woman happened on the streets of **Capernaum**, located on the northwestern shore of the Sea of Galilee, as Christ was going from the house of Matthew the publican, to the house of Jairus the ruler of the synagogue, which were both in this city. Capernaum was part of the region known as the "land of **Gennesaret**."

Is anything recorded in later Scripture about this region that suggests the influence of this woman after she had received her healing? I believe we find an answer in the end of chapter fourteen of Matthew where Christ is once more visiting the "land of Gennesaret."

Matthew 14:34-36


- (34) And when they were gone over, they came into the **land of Gennesaret**.
- (35) And when the men of that place had knowledge of him, **they sent out into all that country round about**, and brought unto him all that were diseased;
- (36) And besought him that they might only touch the hem of his garment: and as many as touched were made perfectly whole.

The disciples had just witnessed the experience of Christ walking on the sea. They had now landed once more in the "land of Gennesaret." The reaction of the people of this area greatly suggest the influence of the woman on their understanding of who Jesus was.

All the region was canvased for anyone having any disease. They were all brought unto Jesus where they **besought him that they might only touch the hem of his garment: and** <u>as many as touched were made perfectly whole.</u>

It would seem that the account of the woman who had touched His garment and been completely healed had been shared all over this region. Who do you suppose was the source of this healing evangelism? Might it have been the one who had been thus healed, who could witness first-hand of the great healing power and compassion of Jesus? How many of those who heard her account of healing had said "I wish I had been there (too)!" Their opportunity to have that same kind of encounter with the Master now seemed to be within reach (literally)!



Again he worked for the White Wing Publishing House until November, 1992 at which time he became involved with The Concerned for Bible Doctrine, serving as Secretary and Treasurer until the Solemn Assembly when he was appointed General Treasurer and placed over the printing operations of the Church.

In 2004 he was appointed to pastor the Fairview church, a short distance from Cleveland. He served as pastor there for a little over one year. He retired from full-time work in January, 2011 and moved to West Virginia in July, 2012 to work in a mission at Seth, which was organized into an active church in February, 2014.

In 2017 he was appointed General Church Historian. In 2018 he was appointed District Overseer of the Southern District (WV) of the newly formed Great Lakes Mountaineer Region and Editor of the region's newsletter.

He has a great love for reading and has written several books, Sunday School lessons, tracts, poems and several other writings, including a monthly column for the Evening Light.

The Lofton's have two daughters and four wonderful grandchildren.






Obedience cannot be forgotten! It will bless us individually, our families, our local churches, and The whole Church of God!

Public Schools were Started to Teach the Bible

Public schools were started in the early American colonies for the purpose of teaching its citizens to read the Bible. A law was passed in 1647 ordering the hiring of a school-master in each township of 50 or more families. The preamble of the law stated: "It being one chief project of that old deluder, Satan, to keep men from the knowledge of ye Scriptures," the Commonwealth must thwart this "old deluder that learning may not be buried in ye grave..." The law became popularly known as the "Old Deluder Satan Act."

Government Is for Our Good

It is the justice of God that *sinning* and *backsliding* be punishable by oppression and chastisement. Such is not for our *destruction* but for our eternal *salvation*.

It has been stated that "divine ideas" have little active power on the lives of people, but "divine officials and institutions" are more readily accepted for such control and discipline. Could this be one of the initial purposes of God in ordaining government for his Church?

We should keep ourselves in an attitude of humble submission to those persons whom God chooses to use as His instruments in delivering us from the evil results of our own negligence or obstinacy, whether the error be that of an individual or a whole congregation.

The Empty Place in the North

One of the most inspiring and thrilling of recent disclosures of astronomers is there is a great empty space in the north in the nebula of the constellation of Orion—a heavenly cavern so gigantic that the mind of man cannot comprehend it and so brilliantly beautiful that words cannot adequately describe it.

The revelations were made possible by gigantic lenses, plus long exposures of photographic plates which in turn can be further magnified. This increases the vision of man so tremendously that he is able to peer into the depth of interstellar space and glimpse the vastness of infinity itself. What has been found correlates with the words of Job: "He stretches out the north over the empty place" (Job 26:7).

All astronomers agree there is a huge opening in Orion which is perhaps more than 16,740,000,000,000 miles in diameter. The diameter around the earth's orbit is 186,000,000 miles, which in itself is incomprehensible to man; yet the opening into this heavenly cavern of Orion is 90,000 times as wide. In other words, there could be 30,000 solar systems like ours with a sun in the middle of each across the entrance of the opening in the north, and still have room to spare.

But surpassing the immensity of its size is its exquisite beauty and the luminous colors that are unlike any upon earth. Professor Learkin of Mt. Lowe Observatory gives us the following description: "These photographs reveal the opening and interior of the cavern so stupendous that our entire solar system would be lost therein. I have watched it since the days of youth in many telescopes of many powers, but never dreamed that the central region is the mouth of a colossal cave. Pen of writer and brush of artist alike are lifeless and inert in any attempt to describe this interior, for the depth of the Orion nebula appear like torn and twisted objects and river masses of shining glass, irregular pillars, columns of stalactites in glittering splendor and stalagmites from the mighty floor. The appearance is like that of light shining and glowing behind the clear walls of ivory and pearl, studded with millions of diamonds like shining stars.

"There must be some reason why all this grandeur is lavished on this one spot in the heavens. The colors are a hue peculiar to the Orion and studded around the opening so that they appear as a pavement of starry sand. No wonder the astronomers (many of them not religious) relate they seem to feel as if they were in some Almighty Presence while scanning this part of the heavens and become speechless before this great outburst of grandeur extending for trillions of miles through space."

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Photos From The Past







This is the very first church building erected by The Church of God since the Arise Shine in 1903. That makes it the first church building for the Church in the state of Tennessee and also in the City of Cleveland. It was built on the corner of 24th and Peoples Streets. It was dedicated by A. J. Tomlinson, September 29, 1907. Ten Assemblies were held at this local church.

Here we think of the prophecy of Daniel 12:4, "But thou, O Daniel, shut up the words, and seal the book, even to the time of the end; many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased."

I wonder why, in Isaiah 14:12-16, at the time of Lucifer's fall, in verse 13, he states, "I will sit also upon the mount of the congregation, in the sides of the NORTH...I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will be like the most high."

The NORTH has a great significance in God's Word. Could it be possible that Revelation 21 might have some connection here? We are sure that many changes of great magnitude are in the making for God's people, but the "how" and the "when" we cannot say; but all these things do encourage our HOPE and our spiritual ambition while we continue to serve.

Without doubt, Paul spoke more truth in his statement (1 Cor. 2:9) than we realize; for "Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him"—beyond all power of comprehension!

THEREFORE, the HOPE we have: "Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; who gave Himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works."

How true it is today that so many of God's dear children simply live and worship for a "blessing," not realizing the great depth and far-reaching meaning of life in its fullness, with a God-given plan for each of us, and that part we may have in the great hereafter.



Read Deuteronomy chapter 7. It will take you through to Glory if you study it with your heart. The worldly churches brag about big numbers but how many have the true Word of God and obey the Scriptures?
