The twenty-third teaching of the Church of God: Against the use of tobacco, opium, morphine, etc. The use of tobacco in any form is forbidden as well as the habitual use of narcotics. These sinful practices defile the body, the temple of the Holy Ghost, and are outward evidences of an impure heart.

Smoking is injurious to health. Each cigarette contains at least twenty different toxic poisons. Among these are arsenic, carbon monoxide, cyanide, and the most famous killer of all, nicotine. One drop of nicotine placed on the tongue of a dog killed the dog in less than one minute. Eight drops killed a horse.

A Russian scientist said, "Nicotine is too potential as a poison to be taken into the human system, and when taken persistently, even in small quantities, it gradually impairs the nervous system, weakens the heart and robs the body of its normal strength and vitality." Another noted scientist, George Washington Carver, said, "Tobacco is neither food nor drink, and man becomes a part of that which he takes in."


One of the most noticeable effects of smoking is in breathing. Smokers tend to have a shortness of breath, and for that reason, it is common practice among coaches of athletic teams to forbid the use of tobacco by the members of the team. Even moderate smoking increases the pulse rate from five to ten beats per minute and causes a rise in blood pressure.

Are tobacco advertisements truthful? You have never seen a distinguished man being carried feet first out of a bar. Neither have you seen advertised in any national magazine a man lying on his bed dying of cancer because he would not stop smoking. No, tobacco advertisements are not truthful. The purpose of tobacco advertising is to sell tobacco.

Before 1923 lung cancer was negligible among women. Why? Because women did not smoke. How did they begin? The advertisers first pictured a woman looking at the man enjoying his smoke. After a period of time they showed the woman holding the package; then we see the woman lighting the cigarette for the man; and now we see women smoking in all kinds of cigarette advertising.

"Since cigarettes seem less provoking unto the ones who do the smoking; oh, won't some power please compel them to smell themselves as others smell them!"

[Editor's note: Thank God in our day tobacco advertisements on TV are illegal in the U.S. Would to God the same was true of liquor advertising as well.]

The Lord On His Throne

(1) In the year that king Uzziah died I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up, and his train filled the temple. (2) Above it stood the seraphims: each one had six wings; with twain he covered his face, and with twain he covered his feet, and with twain he did fly. (3) And one cried unto another, and said, Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of hosts: the whole earth is full of his glory. (4) And the posts of the door moved at the voice of him that cried, and the house was filled with smoke. (5) Then said I, Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts. (Isaiah 6:1-5)

At the time of this vision, Isaiah had already received several wonderful prophecies, such as the *Mountain of the Lord's House*, and the *Great Day of the Lord* in Isaiah 2, *The Branch of the Lord Glorified* in Isaiah 4, and *Woe to the Wicked* in Isaiah 5.

One could wonder why would Isaiah now has this vision of the Lord on His throne? According to David Guzik's *Enduring Word Commentary*, Isaiah was not alone in seeing God's throne. Almost everyone in the Bible who had a vision of heaven, was taken to heaven, or wrote about heaven spoke of God's throne. The prophet Micaiah saw God's throne (1 Kings 22:19), Job saw God's throne (Job 26:9), David saw God's throne (Psalms 9:4; 9:7; 11:4), the Sons of Korah saw God's throne (Psalms 45:6; 47:8), Ethan the Ezrahite saw God's throne (Psalms 89:14), Jeremiah saw God's throne (Lamentations 5:19), Ezekiel saw God's throne (Ezekiel 1:26; 10:1), Daniel saw God's throne (Daniel 7:9), and the Apostle John saw God's throne (Revelations 4:1-11). In fact, the book of Revelation may as well be called "the book of God's throne," because God's throne is specifically mentioned more than 35 times in that book!

The time that this vision occurred was associated with a special event—the passing away of Judah's King Uzziah. He began his reign when he was only 16 years old, and he reigned 52 years. Overall, he was a good king: 2 Kings 15:3 says, ...he did that which was right in the sight of the LORD, according to all that his father Amaziah had done." 2 Chronicles 26:5 says that "...he sought God in the days of Zechariah, who had understanding in the visions of God: and as long as he sought the LORD, God made him to prosper."

Especially note the last part of this scripture: "as long as he sought the LORD, God made him to prosper." And that was the crux of Uzziah's problem. According to 2 Chronicles 26:16 "But when he was strong, his heart was lifted up to his destruction: for he transgressed against the LORD his God, and went into the temple of the LORD to burn incense upon the altar of incense."

He had become so puffed up in himself that he presumed he could enter the temple to offer sacrifices that only the priests, the sons of Arron, were to make. This prideful act cost him dearly according to 2 Chronicles 26:21: "And Uzziah the king was a leper unto the day of his death, and dwelt in a several house, being a leper; for he was cut off from the house of the LORD: and Jotham his son was over the king's house, judging the people of the land."

This final judgement of Uzziah in his dying of his own sin-induced leprosy was fresh on Isaiah's mind when this vision appeared to him of the Lord on His throne "high and lifted up." How could Isaiah presume to enter into the very presence of the Lord? His response was one of absolute fear: "Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts."

In response to Isaiah's humbling himself before God, the remedy for Isaiah's predicament was immediate. According to Isaiah 6:6-7 "Then flew one of the seraphims unto me, having a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with the tongs from off the altar: (7) And he laid it upon my mouth, and said, Lo, this hath touched thy lips; and thine iniquity is taken away, and thy sin purged."

After Isaiah had been purged and could stand in the presence of the Lord, the call of God went forth, and Isaiah immediately accepted the call. "Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I; send me" (Isaiah 6:8).

Surely answering such a call from the Lord should carry with it a promise of great blessings and success in accepting this ministerial call? Such was not to be the case: "And he said, Go, and tell this people, Hear ye indeed, but understand not; and see ye indeed, but perceive not. (10) Make the heart of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and shut their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and convert, and be healed" (Isaiah 6:9, 10).

The way forward for Isaiah would be a difficult one. He was sent to deliver prophecies to a people who would not hear, who would not heed, who would not turn again to the Lord. Especially in his latter years, Isaiah had to prophecy of and indeed witness the destruction that came upon the northern kingdom of Israel, and later upon Judah during the reign of the wicked king Manassas who so desecrated the temple with false altars to idols, etc. According to Hebrew tradition, Isaiah was sawn asunder in a log by an angry Manassas, which corresponds to Hebrews 11:37 Yet through all that he endured; Isaiah stood faithful to God's call. And the Lord blessed him with some of the greatest prophecies to be given a prophet regarding how the Lord in His time would win victoriously over all sin and inequity. It seems that the harder the trials Isaiah faced, the greater the prophecies that the Lord gave to him!

He must have many times questioned why it should be so? What Isaiah could hold on to through those moments was the memory of that experience of being in the presence of the Lord—a reminder that the momentary experiences we endure down here are nothing to be compared to our final destination.

We must never forget that what we see and endure daily as we serve the Lord is nothing in comparison to what we look forward to—when we will stand in His presence. As one song says *"It Will Be Worth It All"*—whatever we must go through down here on this earth as we stand faithful in our service to the Lord.



The Value of a Good Name

"A good name is rather to be chosen than riches, and loving favour rather than silver and gold" (Prov. 22:1).

While men need not bow to the *vainglory* of doing good just to have their name spread on the pages of numerous periodicals, or flashed before the public in blazing lights, it is still better to have a good name simply because such a name helps to glorify the Saviour for whom we are ambassadors.

It is not particularly desirable to strive for a good name; but it is desirable *to be such a man* that the good name will automatically follow. After all, no matter how good the name, *the merit belongs to the Christ* who once took our place.

"Loving favour" probably means to be well-loved; to be esteemed and respected by all good men. This, again, need not be our goal. Our goal should be *to live so in the affec- tions of our Lord* that the *"loving favour"* of men of God would be the natural result.

If men fail to give us a good name, or if they so overlook the godly life that the loving favor never comes our way, so what? God keeps the record. All else matters but little, Praise God!

A Brief History of Mother's Day

In the 1850's a lady by the name of Ann Jarvis established what she called Mothers Fellowship Groups in frontier Virginia to teach women sanitation and other ways to better care for their families. These groups fizzled out as a result of the Civil War.

After the war was over another woman by the name of Julia Ward Howe started a movement she called a Mother's Day of Peace to advocate against any future wars. This fizzled out about ten years later.

Ann Jarvis' daughter Anna, was born on May 1, 1864. After her mother died she wanted to establish a special day for all mothers in honor of her own mother who felt that all mothers should have their special day.

Her vision caught on and the first Mother's Day was celebrated on May 10, 1908 at the Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia. This church building is now an international shrine to the beginning of Mother's Day.

In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating a national recognition of Mother's Day each year on the second Sunday of May.

Anna Jarvis' home is now a museum which can still be visited and is located in Webster, West Virginia.
