



REVIVAL

REVIVAL means re-awakening of interest, restoration to life, a series of evangelistic services for the purpose of religious awakening, etc.

REVIVE—to take up again, renew, to bring back into motion, restore to life, etc.

TRUE REVIVAL is a work of the Spirit in our midst. It is born on the wings of the Spirit as a result of our seeking God for revival. To see revival, we must become hungry and want it more than our necessary food.

True Revival cannot be streamlined around us to fit our schedule. To have revival we must be willing to pay the price.

True revival is not a few days of meetings to include on our reports so we can be counted faithful. The historical records reveal that real revival comes only after a protracted period of prayer, usually with fasting and travail before God.

Most revivals in the past lasted for many weeks, the first week or two being spent to get the saints into their proper relationship with God so He could use them to win sinners to God.

Most revivals included many miracles, gifts of the Spirit and signs and wonders being displayed for the glory of God.

In all of these old-time Holy Ghost revivals, people didn't stop until God was finished with the work He desired to do in their community.

Most old-time revivals resulted in many converts with the membership roll of the Church increasing.

Baptism services nearly always followed real revivals.

MOST OF ALL true revival is not the commercializing of religion by individuals having such business operating in the flesh such as "Revival Inc." etc.

Revival comes from God, and God alone. We cannot manipulate God to give revival on our terms.

From all apparent reasonings, the Church is destined to have another period of great Holy Ghost revival before we are taken out of here. That means that we, as its members, will have to get to the place where we will lay aside all self and yield to God for this final great outpouring upon us and upon the world of ungodly sinners.

Are we ready for revival? Do we truly want revival? If so, we must pay the cost.

Then and only then will God honor us with real Holy Ghost revival and bless us spiritually and increase our churches.



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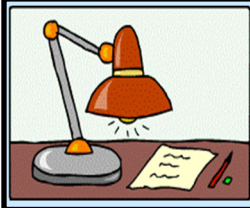

If We This Day Be Examined

In Acts 3 we find the account of the man “*lame from his mother’s womb*” being divinely healed at the words of faith and action shown him by Peter and John. Not only was the man completely, totally healed and able to enter the temple “*..walking, and leaping, and praising God*” but Peter and John had the opportunity to preach to a crowd that had gathered as witnesses of the mighty miracle.

As a result of this divine healing, and the divinely anointed preaching that followed, “*many of them which heard the word believed; and the number of the men was about five thousand.*” (Acts 4:4)

Not everyone was so pleased with what the Lord had done. Specifically, we find in Acts 4:1-3 “*And as they spake unto the people, the priests, and the captain of the temple, and the Sadducees, came upon them, (2) Being grieved that they taught the people, and preached through Jesus the resurrection from the dead. (3) And they laid hands on them, and put them in hold unto the next day: for it was now eventide.*”

The priests, the captain of the temple, and the Sadducees (who did not believe in the resurrection) were “*grieved that they taught the people, and preached through Jesus the resurrection from the dead.*” They could not allow this victory for Jesus Christ to stand!

What was to be done about this matter? Why, they would have to lockup these followers of Christ, until they could deal with them with firmness. Peter and John would be cross examined for what they had done and were now preaching.

Acts 4:3,5-7 “*And they laid hands on them, and put them in hold unto the next day: for it was now eventide. ... (5) And it came to pass on the morrow, that their rulers, and elders, and scribes, (6) And Annas the high priest, and Caiaphas, and John, and Alexander, and as many as were of the kindred of the high priest, were gathered together at Jerusalem. (7) And when they had set them in the midst, they asked, By what power, or by what name, have ye done this?*”

What would be the response of Peter and John? Would they seek mercy and leniency from the Sanhedran? Could they throw themselves prostrate before their judges? We can say most assuredly that they did NOT!

Acts 4:8-10 “*Then Peter, filled with the Holy Ghost, said unto them, Ye rulers of the people, and elders of Israel, (9) If we this day be examined of the good deed done to the impotent man, by what means he is made whole; (10) Be it known*

To many people today are like the chemist who takes a bottle of liquor and analyzes it and can glibly explain its composition, its nature, and give its properties of material substances if contains. But without a drink of it he never feels the effect it produces. Thousands of people today take the Bible and analyze it and put its subjects together and can explain it well who have never felt its power. They take it up, look at it, declare it is the best Book in the world, deliver a beautiful discourse in its eulogy and praise it in the very highest terms. They tell of its power to save, its storehouse of knowledge as history, its poetry, its songs, its prophecies and how true they are—how they have never failed and never will fail—and many other good things too numerous to mention. They do all of this and never experience its power and effect any more than a chemist that analyzes his bottle of liquor and never experiences its thrilling effect if he never gets it into himself deeper than the intellect. (Excerpt of Annual Address of A. J. Tomlinson to the 20th Assembly in 1925.)

SUGGESTIONS TO YOUNG MINISTERS

- 3—Act like a minister in or out of service. Remember the impression you make upon your hearers will have much to do with your success.
- 4—Do your courting like a YOUNG MINISTER should. You must remember Holiness in conduct is necessary for everyone.
- 5—Be clean inside and out if you want to be strong in the Lord. Job (17:9)
- 6—Go no place that a minister should not go. unless, however, your duties take you there.
- 7—Toughen yourself and don't be easily offended. This is required in the ministry.
- 8—Do not seek positions. Let the positions seek you. You should only seek to be worthy.
- 9—Drive your car as a minister should. No minister should hot-rod or race a car unnecessarily. Be a minister to others and not a menace or a threat to the public.
- 10—Do not preach or teach anything that will not stand the inspection of the General Assembly and those over you.
- 11—Be punctual for your appointments and start your announcements when scheduled. (Eccl. 3:1)

EASTER SUNDAY

**Happy Easter to
All**

unto you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, even by him doth this man stand here before you whole."

This "examination" of Peter and John provided them with the opportunity to "turn their examination on its head"—by bringing into question the recent decision of the Sanhedrin to reject Christ. They also declared that the Sanhedrin have no other choice than Christ, if they are to be saved.

Acts 4:11-12 *"This is the stone which was set at nought of you builders, which is become the head of the corner. (12) Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved."*

With this rebuke from Peter, the Sanhedrin was not left with much of an option in how they might deal with Peter and John. (13) *"Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were unlearned and ignorant men, they marvelled; and they took knowledge of them, that they had been with Jesus. (14) And beholding the man which was healed standing with them, they could say nothing against it"* (Acts 4:13-14).

After *"they conferred among themselves,"* they had to admit that *"a notable miracle hath been done by them is manifest to all them that dwell in Jerusalem; and we cannot deny it."*

Acts 4:15-16 *"But when they had commanded them to go aside out of the council, they conferred among themselves, (16) Saying, What shall we do to these men? for that indeed a notable miracle hath been done by them is manifest to all them that dwell in Jerusalem; and we cannot deny it."*

What were the Sanhedrin to do? How might they suppress the further spreading of this wonderful miracle? Acts 4:17-18 *"But that it spread no further among the people, let us straitly threaten them, that they speak henceforth to no man in this name. (18) And they called them, and commanded them not to speak at all nor teach in the name of Jesus."*

They thought that they could threaten them to not speak any more in the name of Jesus. Their plan was greatly flawed, as the response of Peter to their warning quickly revealed: Acts 4:19-20 *"But Peter and John answered and said unto them, Whether it be right in the sight of God to hearken unto you more than unto God, judge ye. (20) For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard."*

Peter had previously turned their examination upside down. Now Peter trashed the plans and schemes of the Sanhedrin to shutdown the preaching of Christ. Peter again turned the judgement of Peter and John back on them: *"Whether it be right in the sight of God to hearken unto you more than unto God, judge ye. (20) For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard."*

How many times are we "examined" by the world, as it seeks every occasion to silence the glorious news we have to share? Today we are living in what has

become a “cancel culture.” According to Wikipedia, **cancel culture** (or **call-out culture**) is a modern form of ostracism in which someone is thrust out of social or professional circles—whether it be online, on social media, or in person. We have seen this behavior of rejection applied to people for a variety of reasons. In particular, Christians for their beliefs and practices are increasingly subjected to this cancel culture. Not only are the ostracized, many have lost friends, and even their employment.

We must have the courage of Peter and John to take a stand for the Word of God. We must likewise turn the world’s examination of Christianity on its head. Rather than slinking off into a corner, or otherwise hiding, we must follow the example of Peter and John’s actions following their “examination.”

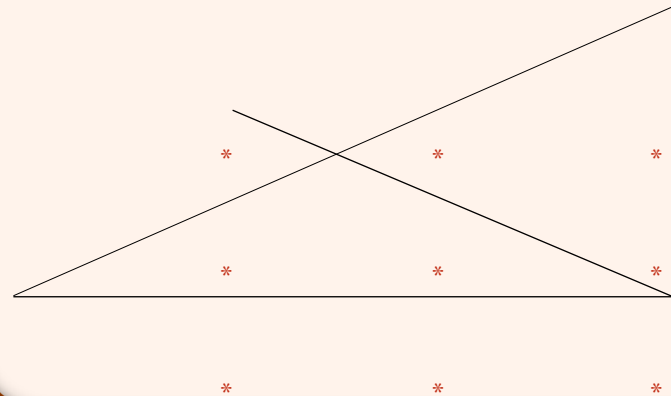
Acts 4:23-31 *“And being let go, they went to their own company, and reported all that the chief priests and elders had said unto them. (24) And when they heard that, they lifted up their voice to God with one accord, and said, Lord, thou art God, which hast made heaven, and earth, and the sea, and all that in them is: (25) Who by the mouth of thy servant David hast said, Why did the heathen rage, and the people imagine vain things? (26) The kings of the earth stood up, and the rulers were gathered together against the Lord, and against his Christ. (27) For of a truth against thy holy child Jesus, whom thou hast anointed, both Herod, and Pontius Pilate, with the Gentiles, and the people of Israel, were gathered together, (28) For to do whatsoever thy hand and thy counsel determined before to be done. (29) And now, Lord, behold their threatenings: and grant unto thy servants, that with all boldness they may speak thy word, (30) By stretching forth thine hand to heal; and that signs and wonders may be done by the name of thy holy child Jesus. (31) And when they had prayed, the place was shaken where they were assembled together; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they spake the word of God with boldness.”*

Basking In The Power of Light

“And God said, let there be light: and there was light. And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness” (Genesis 1:3-4).

The first statement God uttered in the Bible was **“let there be light.”** The first thing He created was light. The Hebrew word translated in this context shows light as illumination, something that clarifies, brightens and brings happiness. The Bible says God saw that the light was good. Darkness is the opposite of light. Darkness depicts evil, something not good, chaos, confusion, ignorance, etc. Below are some of the qualities of light:

Light shines: The believer in Christ is commanded to shine because he has light. The Bible says the gospel of Jesus Christ is the light of the glory of God. It is this light that believers in Christ receive when they give their hearts to Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 4:3-4). The gospel makes its recipient to shine in this dark world, because it is the light of God’s glory. Light reigns because it shines and overcomes darkness. However, the extent of the shining and reigning of the believer is determined by the amount of light (revelation knowledge) he or she possesses and walks in. True believers radiate the glory and brilliance of God in this dark world.

Light heals: It is reportedly known that a good number of babies are born jaundiced. Jaundice is a liver disorder that causes the white part of the eyes and skin to turn yellow. Though potentially dangerous, it has an easy cure. The baby is put under a special light. The skin absorbs this light and stimulates the liver to start functioning well. Human beings are morally and spiritually sick because of sin. The truth of the Scriptures is the light that heals us of spiritual sickness.

Light dispels darkness: Satan is called the prince of darkness. His agents and demonic spirits are called the rulers of the darkness of this world (Ephesians 6:12). His kingdom is called the kingdom of darkness. He majorly rules his dark kingdom with fear, ignorance, hatred, division and deception. The Bible says light shined in darkness and the darkness comprehended it not. It didn't overpower or extinguish it. Light wins over darkness without a fight. Faith in God, the love of God and the truth of the Scriptures are embodiment of the light of God. These qualities when possessed by the believer make him or her to overcome the darkness of this world.

Light rules: The Bible says God created two great lights on the fourth day of creation. The greater light He created was to rule over the day, and the lesser light to rule over the night (Genesis 1:16-19). To rule is to exercise authority or dominion over something. The believer in Christ rules over sin, sickness and

death because of the understanding which the light of God's Word provides him or her. What one understands he gains mastery over. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. He that followeth me shall not walk in darkness but shall have the light of life" (John 8:12). Our understanding of redemption, forgiveness, sanctification and justification gives us mastery over the deception of darkness.

Light quickens: It enlivens and produces life. For most living organisms, life ebbs or ceases to be when light is no more. Plants live by photosynthesis. They convert sunlight energy into food and produce oxygen for mankind. Life and light are mysteriously inseparably linked. Jesus said those who follow Him will have the light that produces and leads to life. Life means being present with God both in this world and in eternity. Darkness is the absence of God.

CONCLUSION: Light organizes and creates order (Genesis 1:2-5), light exposes (Ephesians 5:13) and shields (Romans 13:12). We are enjoined, as children of light, to walk in the light and have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them (Ephesians 5:8-11).
