Even many modern "churches" do not care for they have left the principles of God's Word and "...*changed the truth of God into a lie...*" (Rom. 1:25). A few sincere Christians seem to care somewhat but does not seem to be totally devoted to the great cause of soul winning.



What Should Our Attitude Be Towards Our Lord's Imminent Return?

We are living in a day when an ever-increasing number of people (both Christian and non-Christian) are engaged in discussion and speculation regarding the return of our Lord; including such topics as the everimminent rapture of His sheep, the great tribulation that is to come upon this earth, and His return to judge this world. We have our favorite Scriptures that we turn to find our answers; such as *Matthew* 24, *I* & *II Thessalonians*, *Daniel*, and *Revelations*.

In response to His prediction in *Matthew* 24:1-2 of the destruction of the temple, we find the response of his disciples in Matthew 24:3. "And as he sat upon the mount of Olives, the disciples came unto him privately, saying, Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming, and of the end of the world?

Our Lord responded to their query with a litany of predictions of what would come upon the world as a whole, and what His followers would face.

He gave them, for example, what the world can expect:

Matthew 24:6 ... ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars

Matthew 24:7 ... nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom

Matthew 24:7 ... there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in divers places

And what His <u>disciples</u>, in particular, can expect:

Matthew 24:9 *Then shall they <u>deliver</u> you up to be <u>afflicted</u>, and <i>shall <u>kill</u> you:*

Matthew 24:9 ... ye shall be <u>hated</u> of all nations for my name's sake

Matthew 24:11 ... many <u>false prophets</u> shall <u>rise</u>, and shall <u>deceive</u> many.

Matthew 24:12 ... because <u>iniquity</u> shall <u>abound</u>, the <u>love</u> of many shall <u>wax cold</u>

Then, He concluded this subsection of His discourse with His assurance of our ultimate redemption, if we remain faithful (if we will endure unto the end), and what we can do to hasten His return!

Matthew 24:13 *But he that shall <u>endure</u> unto the <u>end</u>, the same shall be <u>saved</u>.*

Matthew 24:14 And this <u>gospel</u> of the kingdom shall be <u>preached</u> in <u>all</u> the world for a <u>witness</u> unto all nations; and <u>then shall the end</u> <u>come</u>.

We are all a part of the unstoppable mission. Each of us have a mission field right where we are.

Are we seeking God for open doors to share the gospel with the people we are in contact with in our little part of the world? Isn't this our desire?

I have family, you have family, that need to be saved, right? We each have a large mission field and if I might add, a difficult one. We need God. And, we need to band together.

Ladies, WMB Leaders, do you have a prayer band in operation? If not, let's pray for God to help us get one going. I know we all believe prayer changes things. Let's give it a try. Let's exercise our faith. Let's band together and pray.

The Seth WMB prayer band consists of three ladies and we just got started on 3/9/2024. We are starting to meet early on Saturday mornings for Scripture reading and prayer. We are praying for God to equip us, condition us, sanctify, fill us and prepare us for a work in each of our mission fields. We are praying for our region that God will send laborers; people who will stick—who will establish and be settled as members in the Church. We are excited for we trust in God and know God will move on our behalf, if we humble ourselves and pray.

He also has left us His assurance of our ultimate redemption, if we will <u>endure unto the end</u>!

Our Lord's admonition to the Philadelphia church (and indeed to all of us) regarding our enduring is given in Revelation 3:11. *Behold*, <u>*I* come</u> <u>quickly</u>: <u>hold that fast</u> which thou hast, <u>that no man take thy crown</u>.

So many people are now focused on the events coming upon the world, and on the challenges that shall come upon His disciples (those just listed from Matthew being examples). These are important for motivating us to want to be ready for His return.

Let us focus on His last statement (Matthew 24:14). There, He placed a responsibility upon His disciples to fulfill His purpose for this world—*this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a wit-*<u>ness unto all nations</u>. Only after the fulfillment of our commission (the Great Commission of Matthew 28:19-20), *then shall the end come*.

All the tribulation events (wars, famines, etc.) and all the persecutions that He predicted (afflicted, hated, killed) that we would experience as His disciples are in His hands. We will have to trust Him for us to be able to overcome (endure) these. The last item that He described is very much our responsibility. This then is what we ought to be focused upon! The Lord has promised to bring all the wickedness He described to a close with His return in judgment. This victorious overcoming will happen when we have completed our commission: *this gospel of the king-dom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations*.

So, by all means pay close attention as we now see the fulfillment of all that He gave us (personally as recorded in the gospels, as well as through His prophets and apostles) to expect and to prepare to face (endure). But where we ought to be focused is upon the task He has left us to complete before He can return: *this gospel* of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations.

What are you doing to fulfill His commission? You may not be called to preach (e.g., evangelist) or to teach (e.g., certified teacher). But we ALL are called to WITNESS! You may never be a "Billy Graham" preaching to thousands at a time, but you can be used of the Lord in ways that you never could have dreamed. You may only reach one! But oh, what our Lord can do to multiple that one into so many more.

Read John 4 where Christ ministered to the woman at the well. He won one. Then she went and won many of her fellow Samaritans. Then they came and heard Christ for themselves, and many more believed on Him. At the end of that experience when His disciples had returned from procuring something to eat, He shared with them these words:

John 4:32-38 But he said unto them, I have meat to eat that ye know not of. (33) Therefore said the disciples one to another, Hath any man brought him ought to eat? (34) Jesus saith unto them, <u>My</u> <u>meat is to do the will of him that sent me</u>, and to finish his work. (35) Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are <u>white already</u> to <u>harvest</u>. (36) And he that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal: that both he that soweth and he that reapeth may rejoice together. (37) And herein is that saying true, One soweth, and another reapeth. (38) I sent you to reap that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours.

Our <u>meat</u> likewise should be to do His will— to go and to teach all nations. The Lord will bless our efforts. He will multiply His blessings on all that we would do. Whether you are sowing or reaping, do all for the glory of God, so that *he that reapeth may rejoice together*.



Attributes of Being a Christian

"But the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law" (Gal. 5:22).

"For the fruit of the spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth;" {Eph. 5:9).

Keep in Step with the Spirit

"This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh" (Gal. 5:16).

Definition: Christian as noun

1. A believer in the religion of Christ.

2. A professor of his belief in the religion of Christ.

3. A real disciple of Christ; one who believes in the truth of the Christian religion, and studies to follow the example, and obey the precepts, of Christ; a believer in Christ who is characterized by real piety.

4. In a general sense, the word Christian includes all who are born in a Christian country or of Christian parents.

Christian:

1. Pertaining to Christ, taught by him, or received from him; as the Christian religion; Christian doctrines.

2. Professing the religion of Christ; as a Christian friend.

3. Belonging to the religion of Christ; relating to Christ, or to his doctrines, precepts and example; as Christian profession and practice.

4. Pertaining to the church; ecclesiastical; as courts Christian .

So it looks like we are supposed to walk the way Christ walked, act the way Christ asked, He is our example in every part of our lives.

Gal. 5:17 "For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that

ye cannot do the things that ye would."

Most of the time, our enemy is ourselves, not other people. Cannot we bring ourselves under subjection to Christ's teachings?

Gal 5:18 "But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law. (19) Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, (20) Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, (21) Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God."

Look up the things above if someone does you wrong. Does hatred pop up? Are you at variance with someone? Jesus, when they nailed Him to the Cross said, *"Father forgive them for they know not what they do."*

Gal 5:22 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, (23) Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law. (24) And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. (25) If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit. (26) Let us not be desirous of vain glory, provoking one another, envying one another."

The writer makes it plain how we should look. Do you want to be glorified? Do you want to provoke someone? Are you envious of someone?

Are you in the Flesh or in the SPIRIT?

Eph. 4:19-32 "Who being past feeling have given themselves over unto lasciviousness, to work all uncleanness with greediness. (20) But ye have not so learned Christ; (21) If so be that ye have heard him, and have been taught by him, as the truth is in Jesus: (22) That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts; (23) And be renewed in the spirit of your mind; (24) And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness. (25) Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbour: for we are members one of another. (26) Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: (27) Neither give place to the devil. (28) Let him that stole steal no more: but rather let him labour, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth. (29) Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers. (30) And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. (31) Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice: (32) And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath foraiven uou."

Eph. 5:1-21 "Be ye therefore followers of God, as dear children; (2) And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour. (3) But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints; (4) Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks. (5) For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. (6) Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience. (7) Be not ue therefore partakers with them. (8) For ue were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light: (9) (For the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth;) (10) Proving what is acceptable unto the Lord. (11) And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them. (12) For it is a shame even to speak of those things which are done of them in secret. (13) But all things that are reproved are made manifest by the light: for whatsoever doth make manifest is light. (14) Wherefore he saith. Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give thee light. (15) See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, (16) Redeeming the time, because the days are evil. (17) Wherefore be ye not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is. (18) And be not drunk with wine, wherein is excess; but be filled with the Spirit; (19) Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord; (20) Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ; (21) Submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God."
