81, of Carey passed away Sunday, July 19, 2026 in the comfort of his own home surrounded by those he loved.

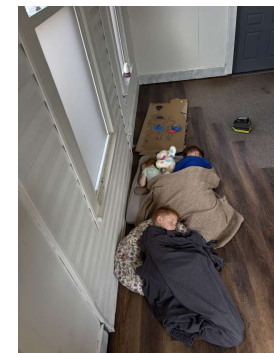
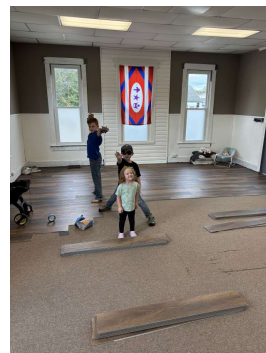
